Testing included in a biometric screening:

- Height
- Weight
- Body Mass Index (BMI)

- Body Fat Percentage
- Waist Circumference
- Blood Pressure
- Total Cholesterol
- HDL
- LDL
- Triglycerides
- Glucose (Fasted)



*Testing concludes with a coaching session with an explanation of all testing results.

*The screening is not a means to diagnose or a substitute for seeing your regular physician, but rather a starting point to become better educated and encourage discussion about diet, exercise, stress, and sleep habits with your physician.

Flu Shots at AAA3 for staff








